Name of Trail: AEP ReCreation Lands - Coshocton County

Directions from nearest main route: Off State Route 83 - 1/2 mile. Large sign at entrance

Trail Land Manager: AEP - Dave Dingey / Coshocton OHC - Mary Bissonnette

Trail Description: Very scenic, rolling hills with sandy type soil

Type of Trail (multi use, bridle/hike, etc) Bridle - may see occasional hiker or fisherman

Trail Surface: Sandy, soft dirt, etc

Normal Trail Condition: Dry - with a few wet spots, but passable

Trail condition during winter/wet weather: Some muddy spots

Length of Trail: 25 miles

Day Use Only, Overnight Camping or Both: Both

Number of Camping Sites: Multiple

Description of Camping Sites: Large open area, parking flexible. Some sites have tie lines and picnic tables

Trailhead parking description: Large gravel area for dayriders - also grass area available

Trailhead horse facilities: Tie-lines, water

Trailhead human facilities: Porta Johns, picnic shelter, and picnic tables

Unique/Scenic trail features: Large Rocks and bald eagles

Trail Hazards: Some high walls - but not close to trail

Trail Rating: _____ Easy - Level or gently sloping terrain, consistent groomed surface; wide trail surface; shallow or no water crossings

X _____ Moderate - Rolling to hilly terrain; short steeper slopes; water crossings; irregular trail surface; narrower trail widths

_____ Challenging - Steeper hills, unimproved trail surfaces, deeper or wider water crossings; boggy areas

_____ Difficult - Very steep hills; long climbs or descents; narrow trail widths, faster flowing and wider water crossings; deep water crossings.
